November 26-28, 2024, Lviv Forum duration: 3 days

The Verkhovna Rada of Ukraine Committee on Social Policy and Protection of Veterans' Rights, the Commissioner for Human Rights of the Verkhovna Rada of Ukraine, and the Interfactional Parliamentary Union "Rehabilitation Forces of Ukraine", Ministry of Veterans Affairs of Ukraine, with the support of the USAID RADA Program: Next Generation, the International Organization for Migration, and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) in Ukraine, are organizing the International Forum "Veterans – The Road Home."

### Objective of the forum:

To present a roadmap for the development of veteran state policies and to create a platform for interaction between veterans, their families, the families of the deceased, missing, or captured individuals, local communities, the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine, the Verkhovna Rada of Ukraine, and international partners.

## Key goals of the forum:

- 1. Present and discuss the main provisions of the roadmap for the development of veteran policies.
- 2. Identify priority areas for cooperation between veterans, their families, the families of the deceased, missing, or captured individuals, local communities, government bodies, and international partners.
- 3. Establish a networking platform with specific mechanisms for interaction and coordination between government authorities, local self-government bodies, non-governmental organizations, and international organizations in the field of veteran policy.

## Workshop 1: "Physical Health/Rehabilitation"

Restoration of bodily functionality after military trauma and combat operations, long-term rehabilitation, developing of a rehabilitation system based on the nosology, and improving the rehabilitation plan through the strengthening of multidisciplinary teams.

#### Workshop 2: "The Psychology Of Societal Trauma"

Development of psychological support in Ukraine, building of a mental health support system, innovative psychological practices, war-torn society and post-war society: mutual support and understanding, psychological trauma, PTSD, the "Gap" phenomenon, and addictions.

## Workshop 3: "Economic Independence"

Veteran employment, two-way adaptation between the team and the veteran, the role of communities and businesses in veteran employment, starting and developing veteran-owned businesses, the role of the community in fostering veteran entrepreneurship, preconditions for successful veteran entrepreneurship, and systematization of approaches.
